

BACKSTAGE AT THE ORANGE COUNTY ARCHIVES Chris Jepsen

Come learn what's in the Orange County Archives when Assistant Archivist and historian Chris Jepsen speaks at our January 21 meeting. Even if you don't have kin in the area, this program may help you better understand archives generally and give you an idea of the kinds of research materials you may find there.

Chris Jepsen has been the Assistant Archivist at the Orange County Archives since 2003, where he collects and preserves historically significant materials and helps people discover the history of their families, homes and communities. He is also a local historian, serves as president of the Orange County Historical Society, and recently founded a new countywide non-profit focused on preserving historic sites.



Jepsen writes for magazines, government publications, historical journals, and his blog: O.C. History Roundup. He lectures often,

is a frequent guest on KUCI-FM's "Vintage Orange" radio show, hosts historical tours, and occasionally curates exhibits.

Located in the Old County Courthouse, <u>211 W. Santa Ana Blvd, Santa Ana</u>, the Orange County Archives welcomes you to visit and use their unique collections of government records and other material documenting the rich history of our county. The Archives is a division of the office of Orange County Clerk-Recorder Hugh Nguyen, and is open to the public on weekdays (except holidays), 9:00 am to noon and 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm. RESEARCHING YOUR HISPANIC ANCESTORS Letty Rodella

Letty Rodella is a retired educator having spent 42 years in the educational field. She graduated from the University of Texas at El Paso and received a Master's Degree from Cal State Fullerton. The years as an educator included teaching elementary school in Texas and in Southern California. She retired as district administrator and upon retirement continued on as an independent educational consultant. In addition to that, she was university supervisor for student teachers attending Cal State Long Beach. Her love of genealogy started 18 years ago, covers the present and moves back in history to her ancestors of the early 1500s, those who settled in what is now Texas and New Mexico. Letty is President of SHHAR, the Society

of Hispanic Historical & Ancestral Research.

This presentation, "Researching Your Hispanic Ancestors", is based on Letty Rodella's years of research using on-line Hispanic archives which date back to the 1500's. Letty will explain the basic steps she uses and will present copies of actual document found using those steps. She will provide tips for reading the many nuances found in those documents; will offer suggestions for finding the previous generation; and will provide a list of the main resources available for researching Hispanic ancestors.

Patrons creating a free account and signing in fulfills that need.

Patrons sign in will also enable FamilySearch to satisfy the ongoing need for user authentication. This authentication can deliver rich, personalized discovery, collaboration, and help experiences. Simply put, signed-in visitors can access more searchable content and enjoy more personalized services.

"A large percentage of our current site visitors are not benefiting from much of what FamilySearch has to offer because they don't realize the need to

simply sign in with their free account to do so," said Steve Rockwood, FamilySearch CEO. "They are basically arriving in the parking lot but not coming inside for the main event," he said about website visitors who do not sign in.


