A Pearl Harbor Connection

As we get ready to observe the 80th anniversary of Pearl Harbor, yes 80 years, I'd like to share my Father-in-Law's unique relationship to that date.



On Nov 28, 1941, Richard Elliott (20), his nephew Jim Millhouse (22), his Uncle William Reynolds (57) along with his future brother-in-law, Vincent Stevenson, (23) set sail on the S.S. Lurline for pipefitter jobs in Wake Island with the Pacific Naval Air Bases. They landed in Honolulu T.H. for a few days lay over and little did they know what was to come on December 7, 1941.

As Rich told it, after the horror of the devastation from the attack, he and many others took turns waiting in line for three days to be able to call home so his mother Myrtle, and his fiancée, Gloria, would know his status. Rich, Jim, Vincent and William were only allowed three minutes per call. All Rich's mother did was cry when she received the call from him.

Obviously, their plans to continue to Wake Island was now not an option, so while awaiting transportation back

or the control of the

to the mainland, the men found work, mostly with the Navy doing cleanup. Rich and Vincent drove huge diesel dump trucks capable of holding 35 tons that were used to clear debris from the harbor. Life began to return to normal on the islands and Rich who had been a good basketball player in high school played basketball on one of the island

Vince's Hawaii Operator License teams. Several articles were found in a scrap book about him playing on a team and how the team did in league play on the islands.

It took about nine months to get back to the mainland and I was able to find a record of his return, on August 15, 1942 to San Francisco. Then, on September 20, 1942 Rich married his

fiancée Gloria and shortly after joined the Army in November 1942. He served in the European theater in the 100th Evacuation Hospital, and was part of a "MASH" unit. As he described it, he waited until the person in charge pointed to a spot on the ground then he, and others, set up the unit. His military record tells a much more detailed account of his many duties. The hospital followed various armies from

Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and Central Germany, including the liberation of a concentration camp. He was honorably discharged on November 23, 1945 as a Staff Sergeant and was awarded the Bronze Star.

Rich's now brother-in-law, Vincent, also joined the Army and became a paratrooper. He participated in the Battle of the Bulge and his body carried the shrapnel he was wounded with for the rest of his life. Vincent was the recipient of a Purple Heart.

In my opinion, these are two fine examples of Tom Brokaw's "Greatest Generation".


