One take away was that the census will not include any person who was overseas on April 1, 1950. This is not good if your family member was in the military stationed outside of the U.S. or its territories. This could also include whole

families.

Joel has put together many YouTube videos regarding the census. It seems that the information from the National Archives keeps changing so he has updated some of these videos. Check him out.

Following up on my previous messages about using social media, I had a Zoom meeting recently with Loretta whom I talked about last month. We shared some stories and had a great visit. She lives near where my grandmother grew up so she will be a wonderful resource of information. During our visit, we figured out that we are 4th cousins 2X removed on our Babcock line. 
