Read any good books lately?

The Stranger in My Genes by Bill Griffeth

Bill Griffeth, a television journalist for CNBC, takes a routine DNA test that launches him into a quest to discover the truth about his parentage. Is the family tree he's been documenting all these years not his after all? This is a well-written memoir which reveals family secrets as Griffeth takes us along on his journey to solve the mystery.

Griffeth is not a newcomer to genealogy. He's been at it for over two decades, and when he wrote this book in 2016, he was a Trustee of the New England Historic Genealogical Society.

The Stranger in My Genes is a riveting page-turner and, at only 185 pages, is an easy read. My only complaint is that the print is a bit smaller than I like—the older I get the larger I want my font—but not so small as to make me curse or throw it across the room. Griffeth's story is well worth your time and I highly recommend it.

I just noticed online that he has a sequel, Strangers No More, coming out next month. Can't wait to read it!
