October 15, 2023 Speaker is Christine Cohen Presenting on: Indexes Are The Key To Unlocking The Records



Christine Cohen is a long-time member of the Whittier Area Genealogical Society (WAGS) and is currently the Program Director. In addition to WAGS, she is also a member of the El Redondo Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Society of Daughters of Holland Dames and the Association of Professional Genealogists. Christine's interest in genealogy began in 1977 with the airing of the TV mini-series "Roots" and was piqued when I found a typed pedigree chart of my Dutch

heritage from the New Netherlands in the 1660's. Christine is a native Californian, a graduate of UCLA in Political Science and has worked for Vitol Aviation Company since 1993.

Member Corner

Thanks to Bob Prager for submitting the following information.

The National Park Service maintains a database of Civil War combatants at: https://www.nps.gov/civilwar/soldiers-and-sailors-database.htm, but offers limited search options. If you have a Civil War ancestor, you're probably aware of this.

However, https://www.bettersoldiersandsailors.com, a free web site, offers better options. It starts with the same databases as the National Park Service but offers more powerful tools (e.g., phonetic searches, wildcards, etc.), adds additional databases (including Civil War burials and Court Martial records) not available at the NPS site, and includes advice about how/where to get copies of the soldiers' military records, among other powerful features.

A simple search can be performed by entering the desired name, but to access all of the advanced search tools, click on "Advanced Search." This allows filtering the results by different parts or spelling of the name and several categories of military service information.

Connecticut Genealogy Index

https://connecticutgenealogy.org/

Looking for information on somebody who was born, got married, had a civil union, or died in Connecticut?

This free searchable database provides a basic index to modern era records that were filed with the Connecticut Department of Health. This site doesn't host any actual certificates, but it can help you confirm if a record exists. You can then request a copy either from the municipality where the event took place or from the state directly.

For births, this database contains an index to all certificates that were filed with the state between July I, 1897, which was the start of mandatory statewide registration, and December 31, 1917, the most current data available that is not under legal restriction.

For marriages and deaths, this database provides an index to all records that were filed with the state between mid-1897 and December 31, 2017.

For civil unions, this database provide an index to all unions formally registered at the state level, which began in October 2005. Nearly all of these were automatically converted over to full state-recognized marriages in October 2010, then federally recognized in June 2015. Earlier records for domestic partnerships (which are legally distinct from civil unions), were filed with some of the individual towns and cities in Connecticut dating back to circa 1993, or with religious institutions, but were not kept at the state level, and are not included here.
